




History and Origin

"True Love" is a popular song written by Cole Porter and was published in 1956. The song was introduced by Bing Crosby and Grace Kelly in the musical film High Society. "True Love" was nominated for the Academy Award for Best Song. The Crosby–Kelly version, accompanied by Johnny Green's MGM studio orchestra using a romantic arrangement by Conrad Salinger, was a hit single, peaking No. 4 in the United States and No. 4 in the UK. A 1983 re-issue reached No. 70 in the UK. Kelly's contribution on the record is relatively minor, duetting with Crosby on only the final chorus. Nonetheless, the single is co-credited to her and became her only gold record. It was Crosby's 21st gold record. "True Love" is the name of a yacht on which two of the characters honeymoon in the play The Philadelphia Story, on which the musical is based. Bing Crosby later owned a 55-foot Constellation yacht which he named the "True Love".

- 1957, Elvis Presley cut a version of "True Love" that was featured on his album Loving You.

- 1960, Dean Martin, recorded the song for his album This Time I'm Swingin!
- 1961, Patsy Cline covered the song on her second studio album, Patsy Cline Showcase.
- 1962, Shelley Fabares cut a version of the song on her album Shelley!
- 1962, Al Hirt released a version on his album, Trumpet and Strings.
- 1963, Single by Richard Chamberlain from the album Richard Chamberlain Sings
- 1965, A version by Nancy Sinatra was released as a single.
- 1965, Jack Jones as the closing tune for There's Love and There's Love and There's Love.
- 1974, By Connie Francis.
- 1974, On the album ""I'm Leaving It All Up to You"" by Donny and Marie Osmond.
- 1977, Single by George Harrison from the album "Pure Smokey"
- 1977, A version by George Harrison done in a blues rock style, from his 1976 album.
- 1984, Oasis recorded a version on their one album, Oasis.
- 1988, A version by Shakin' Stevens, from his album A Whole Lotta Shaky, reached #23 in the UK.
- 1993, Elton John and Kiki Dee recorded the song and the single reached #2 in UK, and #56 in the U.S
- 1993, Anne Murray recorded a cover of the song for her album Croonin'.
- 1998, Neil Diamond covered the song for his album The Movie Album: As Time Goes By.
- 2013, Deana Martin recorded "True Love" on her album Destination Moon as a duet with her father.
