

History and Origin

Rise and Shine and Give God the Glory, Glory is a fun song that children of all ages love to sing! Tells of the great flood, with Noah and the animals. This is a traditional favorite for many campfires and Vacation Bible Schools. It appears in hymnals such as, Complete Anglican Hymns Old and New #883, Sing With Me #66, and Worship in Song #23. Was also recorded and released in 1993 by Cedermont Kids. It was also recorded by Pete Seeger, "Children of the Lord" (on PeteSeeger11). The author is unknown and the earliest date on record is 1874 found in Dett, pp. 198-199, "Rise an' Shine" (1 text, 1 tune; pp. 212-213 in the 1874 edition). It has a Roud #11968.

DESCRIPTION: "God said to Noah, there's gonna be a floody, floody.... (So) Rise and shine and give God the glory, glory... Children of the Lord." Noah builds the ark; the animals arrive, including elephants and kangaroos; it rains; it dries up; everything is normal again. Praise God for saving the world by getting up early (Rise) and doing His work (Shine).
